

HAMPTON PARK POOL RULES

SECTION I: MANAGEMENT

The pool facility is under the supervision of the facility manager(s) and lifeguards. They have the authority to enforce all rules and regulations and are authorized to temporarily suspend pool privileges for anyone violating these rules.

The facility manager(s) or Board of Directors will have the authority to adapt rules as they see fit for the safety and convenience of members and guests.

SECTION II. ENFORCEMENT OF RULES & REGULATIONS:

Each member of the management staff has the responsibility for the enforcement of the rules & regulations. Parents are requested to caution their children to observe all rules and regulations and to obey the instructions of the manager and staff. Children and adults are expected to show them proper respect and cooperation at all times. The facility manager(s) have the authority to suspend pool privileges for a period not to exceed the remainder of the swimming day. The pool manager(s) will contact a HOA Board of Directors member following the suspension of a child and the parents will be notified in writing that same day. The manager may recommend to the Facilities Committee suspension for periods longer than the remainder of the swimming day. Suspensions exceeding the remainder of the swimming day can be appealed to the HOA Board of Directors

Cause for Suspension

- a. An individual has been persistently disobedient of pool rules after warnings from lifeguards
- b. An individual displays a disregard for the lifeguards' authority;
- c. In the opinion of the manager/assistant manager, an individual knowingly endangered another pool visitor, lifeguard, him/herself in the pool facility.

Any individual(s) using the pool after hours, could lose all pool privileges for the remainder of the season. The Board of Directors will consider individual events.

Any individual(s) committing acts of vandalism to the pool, Funhouse, Festival House, pool equipment and/or surrounding area will lose all pool privileges for a period of time to be determined by the Board of Directors and be held responsible for cleaning and/or repair of damaged items. In the event the individual(s) are juveniles, the parents shall assume full responsibility for their child's actions. The Board will consider individual events.

SECTION III: IDENTIFICATION AND ADMISSION TO THE POOL

1. All members must have a valid pool pass before entering the pool.
2. Admission to the pool will be refused to all persons who are delinquent in their Hampton Park Homeowner's Association dues and/or fines.
3. Admission to the pool will be refused to persons having or exhibiting the following:
 - a. Intoxication.
 - b. Skin diseases or inflammation – including poison ivy;
 - c. Disease or inflammations of the eyes, ears, nose, throat, or any other part of the body.
 - d. Any communicable disease, open sores or excessive sunburn;
4. Appropriate swim attire is required. No "cut-offs" or thongs are allowed.
5. Children who are not toilet trained are required to wear approved swim diapers or rubber/plastic pants.
6. The following rules apply for admission of children without an adult:

- a. Children under 12 years of age* must be supervised by an adult or responsible chaperone 15 years or older
- b. Children may enter the pool alone provided they are 12 years of age* by September 30th of the current year and they have satisfactorily completed provisions.
- c. At the discretion of the Swim Metro Staff, swimmers of questionable ability may be required to take a swim test. Non-swimmers in the pool will be required to be within arms reach and actively supervised by someone 15 years of age or older.
- d. Proof of age must be provided by a valid form of identification, e.g. Birth certificate, passport or school records
- e. A signed permission form on file with the association
- f. Children ages 12-14 cannot chaperone underage children to the pool - NO Exceptions

Live-in nannies and babysitters who are not Hampton Park homeowners must also have a pool pass on file if they are to accompany members' children to the pool. Members should contact the Pool Committee to arrange for the pass. The sitter and/or nanny will be issued a temporary pass and may use the pass only while escorting the members' children to the pool. A live-in nanny is entitled to full pool privileges. However, live-in nannies and babysitters may not invite guests to the pool. Passes for live-in nannies and babysitters must be reissued each year.

SECTION IV: GUESTS

1. Members are fully responsible for their guests' behavior while they are on the premises.
2. All pool guests must be accompanied by a Member with a guest pass .

SECTION V: GENERAL RULES OF CONDUCT

1. PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES IN THE POOL AREA:
 - a. Running, pushing, dunking, sitting on shoulders, horseplay, tag, rough play, and other rough games.
 - b. Personal radios not being used with earphones.
 - c. Spitting, loud, abusive, offensive or profane language.
 - d. Pets.
 - e. Littering
 - f. All wheeled vehicles, such as skateboards, bikes, mopeds etc.(wheelchairs and locked strollers will be permitted.) Rollerblades and/or roller-skates may be carried into the pool area and stored with personal belongings but may not be worn within the pool fences.
 - g. Impeding the lifeguard in performance of duties.
 - h. Glass containers and any other type of glass objects are not permitted within the pool area and on all paved areas outside the pool area.
2. No floats, tubes, snorkels, or masks are permitted in the pool area. Noodles, water wings, life-vests, and other infant and small child floatation devices will generally be allowed at the discretion of lifeguards. Devices that a child cannot slip out of, for example, a coast-guard approved life vest, or devices that are a part of a child's swim apparel, or otherwise attached to the child or their swim apparel, are preferred.

3. Water wings, noodles, and other floatation devices mentioned will only be permitted in the roped-off shallow area of the pool. Children using such devices must be within reaching distance of a responsible adult at all times.
4. No diving is permitted except during scheduled swim team practices or competitions when supervised by a coach.
5. Do not sit or hang on lifelines or lane-lines.
6. Starting blocks may only be used during scheduled swim team practices or competitions when supervised by a coach.
7. Eating and food is not allowed in the pool or at the pool's edge.
8. NO SMOKING IN THE POOL AREAS.¹
9. No water balloons are permitted in and near the pool.
10. Pool parties are not allowed unless a rental agreement is on file with the on-site manager
11. No super-soaker water guns, or like devices, are permitted in the pool area.
12. Swimmers of questionable ability may be required to pass a swim test to swim in the deep end.
13. Anything deemed by lifeguards as unsafe is not permitted.

SECTION VI: TEMPORARY CLOSURES

1. Management reserves the right to temporarily close the facility for threatening weather conditions. Pool and deck area must be cleared and remain clear for 30 minutes following last visible lightning or thunder.
2. If a fecal accident occurs, all swimmers must exit the pool immediately. The pool will be closed so that it may be chemically treated. The pool must be cleaned, disinfected and tested, and proven to be free from contamination before the pool will be reopened.

SECTION VII: WADING POOL AND SPLASH POOL

1. Children 7 years of age and older are prohibited from the baby pool area. While using the baby pool all children must be supervised by an adult. NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY.
2. The splash pool (water feature) at Celebration pool is intended for the use of small children. Older children who are roughhousing, running through the splash pool, or otherwise causing unsafe conditions for the smaller children, will be asked to leave the splash pool area.

SECTION VII: INJURIES

1. All injuries occurring on the premises must be reports to the facility manager(s) at once!

SECTION VIII: HAMPTON PARK FESTIVAL SLIDE RULES

1. One person is allowed on the slide at a time.
2. One person is allowed on the pool ladder at a time.

¹ At Celebration, the pool area is the area defined as the area inside the pool fence, under the concession cover and in the direct walkway to the pool gate. At Festival, the pool area is the area defined as the area inside the pool fence, Festival House back deck and in the direct walkway to the pool gate.

3. The slider must be out of the splash area before the next rider may go down
4. Swimmers must immediately exit the splash area after exiting the slide. No swimming is permitted in the splash area.
5. Slider must go down the slide in a feet-first sitting or laying position.
6. No double riding (for safety reasons, parents are not permitted to ride down the slide with children).
7. Sliders must be able to swim the length of the pool and be able to tread water to use the slide.
8. No stopping or standing on the slide.
9. No life jackets, flotation devices, noodles, kick boards, water wings, balls, goggles or masks are permitted on the slide.
10. No swimming is permitted in the splash area during slide use.
11. No one is permitted to "catch" children exiting the slide.
12. Swimmers must be wearing appropriate attire. No swimsuits with metal rivets, jeans or cut-offs are permitted.
